

#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

I'm fascinated by Jen Silverman's work.

All of her plays consider who is visible in society, in particular how *women* are seen and the space they are permitted to take up and what's required to break out of those boundaries.

Although THE MOORS is set in the past and inspired by the lives and stories of the Bronte sisters, it is no period piece. This is a play about right now

The dialog is clever, contemporary and very funny.

And the stage directions are fabulous. "Set in 1840's...ish." There's a lot of freedom in there.

Silverman, brilliantly, sets the story in the Victorian past but gives it a modern sensibility that allows us to see how little society has changed and that yesterday's struggles continue today.

As I prepared to work on THE MOORS, I became fascinated with not only the concept of who is seen but how our own visibility becomes the lens through which we see others.

Because what we **see** and what's left **unseen** shapes everything we believe about ourselves.

We cannot become what we cannot see.

And...you've gotta love any play with the tagline, "The Ravenous Crows are Circling."

Portable assistive listening devices for conventional listening are available and may be checked out at the Concessions Counter.

**ELECTRONIC DEVICES**: NO cameras or recording devices of any kind (including smartphones) are allowed to be used in the theater. Please turn off all electronic equipment.

#### **AUDIO LOOP INSTRUCTIONS**

T-Coil Listeners: Simply set your hearing device to the Loop setting and enjoy the show.

**Conventional Listeners:** Check out a receiver and headphone set at the Concessions Counter. The House Manager can instruct you on its use, but here are some simple instructions.

Like a transistor radio, the small box has an off-on and volume knob; turn on and adjust for your comfort level. You will need to be in the seats to receive the Loop signal.

The box works directionally; that is, it matters which way it is pointing.

- In most of our seating, the box works best when held up straight, with the volume knob on top, and the flat back pointing toward the stage.
- In the front rows, you will get the strongest signal with the box laying flat on your leg, with the flat back pointing straight to the floor.

Please ask the House Manager for assistance, if needed. We hope you enjoy the show.


